Terms and Definitions

1. Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) are primarily for:
 - a. Web content developers
 - b. Web authoring tool developers
 - c. Web accessibility evaluation tool developers
 - d. Anyone who wants or needs a standard for web accessibility
2. [POUR](#) - an acronym for four high-level principles that describe functional accessibility.
 - a. Perceivable - Information and user interface components must be presentable to users in ways they can perceive.
 - b. Operable - User interface components and navigation must be operable.
 - c. Understandable - Information and the operation of the user interface must be understandable.
 - d. Robust - Content must be robust enough to be interpreted reliably by a wide variety of user agents, including assistive technologies.

User agents

1. Assistive Technologies and Adaptive Strategies
 - a. Screen Readers
 - b. Screen Magnification
 - c. Eye-tracking
 - d. Accelerators
 - e. Keyboard customization
 - f. Pop-up and animations blockers
 - g. Refreshable Braille display
 - h. Reading assistants
 - i. Page maps

Image Types

1. Simple - The image conveys simple information
 - a. Photos
 - b. Illustrations
2. Complex - The image conveys complex information
 - a. Graphs
 - b. Charts
3. Decorative - The image is purely decorative, not informative
 - a. Spacers
 - b. Borders
4. CAPTCHAs - Confirms whether we are human
5. Images of Text - Images of text that display text that is intended to be read
6. Groups of Images - The text alternative for one image conveys the information for the group
 - a. Star Ratings
7. Image Maps - An image that contains multiple clickable areas
 - a. Park Maps
 - b. Org Charts
8. Functional Images - Functional images are used to initiate actions rather than to convey information
 - a. Buttons
 - b. Links

Slideshows

1. Provide the ability to turn off the player
2. Provide visible controls accessible to the keyboard, mouse, and touch
3. Highlighted on focus with no keyboard traps
